JOHN GORMLEY

This July we very sadly lost a great servant of Britain GAA, John Gormley. The former President of the Provincial Council of Britain, current Central Council Delegate, and current vice chairperson of Hertfordshire GAA was a huge supporter of underage development. He was one of the founding members of the All Britain Competition, making it poignant that he passed away on the Sunday of this year's competition. Nothing made John happier than to be at the ABCs, driving around in his Golf Buggy overseeing the event, watching thousands of children, including his own grandchild playing Gaelic Games. The event will now be his legacy.

John arrived in Luton from Cloon Co Leitrim in August of 1974, aged just 16. Within a week of arriving, a new neighbour, Bill Barrett, had him out playing his first game for St Dympnas against Dr. Crokes in Harrow. For the next 49 years, he would be a loyal member of the St Dympnas Club, holding the role of Chairperson for many years and having a 25-year playing career for them, becoming well known for his famously long kickout. John represented Hertfordshire at Junior, Under 21, and Minor Level, also taking on the role of County Manager in 2000, guiding Hertfordshire to their last All Britain Junior Football Championship Title. He wore many hats in Hertfordshire from his first county board meeting in 1980, including Chairperson, Vice Chairperson and Development Officer.

John lived and breathed the GAA. We are bereft of his expertise, his knowledge, his passion, his personality and his love. There are not enough words to describe everything he did for the development of our games across Britain but we thank John for his dedication and passion and we again offer our sympathies to his wife Bernadette, son, Kieran, and daughters, Katherine and Louise.

His loss has been felt by so many across the GAA but his legacy will live on.
